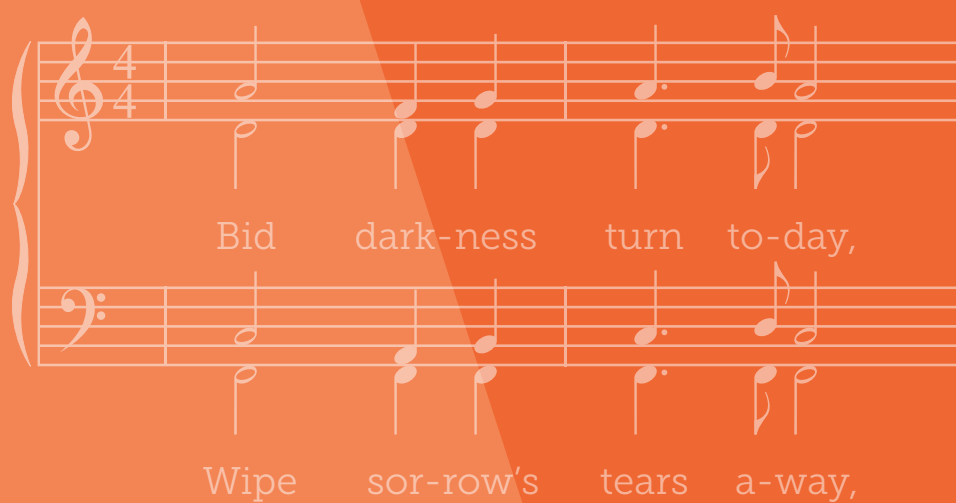

ALL HANDS MISSION DISASTER RELIEF



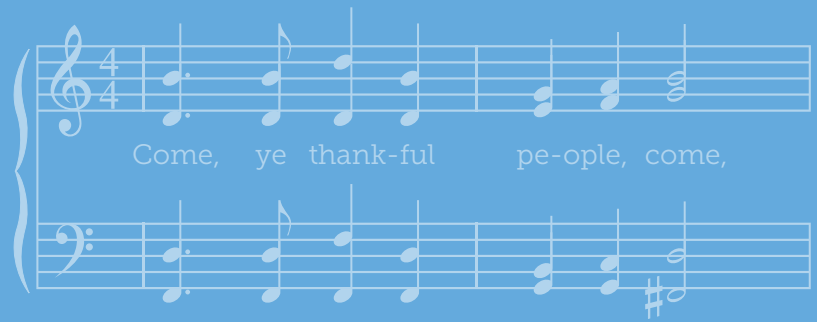

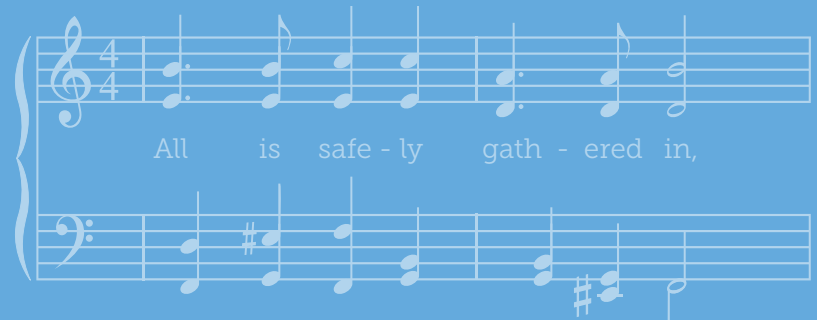

COMFORT & CARE HARVESTFEST

Caring For Others held its largest food and clothing distribution to date this Thanksgiving for their 22nd annual Comfort & Care Harvestfest, which takes place every year before the holiday. This event is designed to provide those suffering in poverty the opportunity to celebrate with loved ones and give thanks. The distribution gave full Thanksgiving meals and new winter clothing to 1,500 families.

Comfort & Care is a reminder that even in times of difficulty there is always hope, and that we can come together to create a brighter future. The event is an excellent example of how Caring For Others works to build stronger and more resilient communities by promoting compassion and empathy.

The world continues to face unprecedented challenges, from the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic to natural disasters, economic inflation, and social upheaval. Through it all, Caring For Others has remained committed to its mission of supporting those in need, providing comfort and care to those who may be feeling lost or alone.



NO BARE SOLES

Now in its 2nd decade, this year's No Bare Soles program gave away 800 pairs of brand new shoes in the Atlanta community, and hundreds more to communities overseas. This initiative is designed to provide shoes and socks to individuals who may be experiencing homelessness or living in poverty. The program works by collecting new shoes and socks from donors and distributing them to those in need. The goal of the No Bare Soles program is to provide these necessities to the community so they can walk with dignity, especially for the children as they return to school in the Fall.

SOUTH ATLANTA FOOD BANK EXPANSION

Caring For Others was blessed to be so full of donations that we had to expand our headquarters' footprint with the construction of a new storage building for the South Atlanta Food Bank. Construction was completed on a new 5,000 square-foot building which will allow the organization to expand its daily food distribution to over 80,000 pounds per day in an effort to remove food insecurity from the area. The Food Bank expansion of the is just one example of how Caring For Others is committed to always reaching to expand its impact in the world.

A Circle of Hope in our community, Caring For Others awards grants to surrounding schools, sponsors field trips, and provides direct financial aid to our teachers to help them meet the needs of their students.

Caring For Others also directly supports deserving students in need through the Education Resource Support (ERS) Scholarship Fund. The ERS Scholarship Fund provides students the funds needed for technology, books, housing and other student necessities. We believe that by supporting the education of our children, we can help to break the cycle of poverty and create a brighter future for all.

Caring For Others also provides international aid to children in communities around the world. From providing shoes to children in South Africa who are playing soccer in the streets barefoot to feeding hundreds of individuals in Guyana every month, we believe that every child deserves access to basic necessities, and we are committed to doing our part to make that a reality.

CHRISTMAS IN SEPTEMBER

A new program in 2022, Christmas in September in partnership with Toys For Tots and Good360, provided new toys, clothes, and school supplies to hundreds of families to kick-off the holiday season without the stress of what the children would find under the tree Christmas morning. Our jolliest distribution of the year, we want to ensure every child deserves to experience the joy of the holiday season, regardless of their family's financial situation. Through this program, we help to create happy memories for children who may not have had the opportunity to experience the magic of Christmas otherwise.

THE 5TH ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL POVERTY FORUM

Caring for Others successfully hosted its fourth International Poverty Forum in 2023, continuing to elevate its mission to eradicate poverty both locally and globally. The forum brought together brilliant minds from different parts of the world to discuss solutions to the poverty crisis at the Delta Flight Museum in Atlanta. The event focused on six key areas of food insecurity, clothing insecurity, shelter and homelessness, education, physical and mental health, and employment and financial stability.

The forum was attended by notable personalities from various fields including human services, philanthropy, politics, and professional sports. The event was headlined by Mr. Earvin "Magic" Johnson, NBA Hall of Famer, businessman, and philanthropist, who shared his insights on how to create economic opportunities and empower underserved communities. Other speakers included former Atlanta Mayor Shirley Franklin, Honorary Consulate General of the Philippines Raoul "Ray" Donato, Kroger's Atlanta Division Corporate Affairs Manager Tammie Young-Ennaemba, moderator Monica Pearson, and Caring For Others spokesman and NFL Hall of Famer, Champ Bailey.



This year's forum produced several innovative solutions to tackle the poverty crisis. Some of the key ideas included providing education and job training programs to empower individuals, implementing a more sustainable approach to combat food insecurity, and creating more affordable housing options for homeless individuals.

The day following the forum, Caring for Others hosted a community distribution that provided essential resources to families in need. In addition Caring for Others was able to provide dozens of new mattresses and flat screen TVs to seniors.

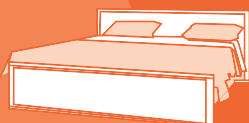
